

Oral - Facial & Implant Surgery, P.A.

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Instructions following Oral Surgery

TODAY

1. Control of Bleeding

- a. Continue placing pressure on gauze for 1 hour after surgery-
- b. Following this, slight oozing of blood will continue and is NORMAL.
- c. If brisk bleeding should occur (with clots of blood forming inside the mouth), place gauze pad over area of bleeding and maintain CONSTANT pressure for 1 hour,

2. Nourishment

- a. It is best to stick to liquids or very soft foods on the day of surgery.
- b. Do not use straws for 24 hours postoperatively.

3. Activity

- a. Rest at home the day of surgery.
- b. No smoking for at least 24 hours preferably 5 days postoperatively.

TOMORROW

1. Rinsing & Cleaning of the Mouth

- a. Beginning _____ tomorrow, rinse mouth with warm salt water three times a day (1/4 tsp. of salt per glass), for 2 weeks.
- b. Beginning with the day after surgery, you may eat solid foods as tolerated.
- c. Resume normal tooth brushing as soon as possible.

Swelling & Discoloration

- a. Facial swelling is normal after oral surgery ice is helpful during the first 24 hours. Maximum swelling will be on the 3rd day.
- b. Discoloration of the skin may follow surgery. This is normal and will gradually fade and disappear. Moist heat applied to the face will reduce this.

Medications

- a. Take medications as prescribed.
- b. If you have any problems with the medication or any other problems, call our office.

For Patients Who Have Had IV Anesthesia

- a. D0 NOT drive for at least 12 hours,
- b. A black and blue mark and soreness occasionally develops on the arm at the site of the intravenous injection. This is normal and will disappear. Moist heat will help.
